April Meeting Spotlights Driving Electric

The Southeast Florida Clean Cities Coalition hosted its first meeting of the year on Friday, April 8, 2016 at the South Florida Regional Council. The theme of the event was how to advance electric vehicles (EVs) and supportive infrastructure in the region.

The meeting included indoor EV infrastructure displays as well as outdoor EV and EV charging displays. Natalia Neira, 2015-2016 Clean Cities University Workforce Development Intern, presented a summary of Coalition accomplishments. Anne-Louise Seabury of Florida Power & Light Company and Penni Redford of the City of West Palm Beach were among the speakers who discussed the future of electric vehicles. The EcoEagles team from Embry Riddle University discussed the new generation of the American muscle car - their hybrid EcoCAR3 Chevrolet Camaro which is a high-performance vehicle running off a battery pack and E85.

Coalition members and stakeholders celebrated and recognized FPL's Anne-Louise Seabury for her many contributions in support of the Coalition and Southeast Florida. Seabury has devoted the past several years of her career to educating the public about electric vehicle ownership. At the event Seabury was recognized as the Coalition's Drive Electric Champion and awarded for her efforts.

Electric charging station displays were sponsored by Brickell Energy, Car Charging Inc, Crown Electric, and Doc Bornee USA. Electric car displays included the Embry Riddle EcoCAR2 – a converted 2013 Chevrolet Malibu, 2016 Ford CMax Energi from AutoNation Ford Margate, 2016 Nissan Leaf complements of Weston Nissan, and stakeholder-owned Chevy Volt and BMW i3 models.
