PROPOSED SFRC RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE STRATEGIC MIAMI AREA RAPID TRANSIT

(SMART) PLAN

SFRC Resolution 16-01 supports Miami-Dade County's and Miami-Dade Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO) efforts to advance transit corridors and transit supportive projects in the South Florida Region. The Miami-Dade MPO has authorized Step 3 Project Development for the Strategic Miami Area Rapid Transit (SMART) Plan, which identifies six Rapid Transit Corridors. A critical component of the plan is a connected network of Bus Express Rapid Transit (BERT) system in order to comprehensively expand the reach of mass transit in the State's most congested and populated region.

In 2010, the South Florida and Treasure Coast Regional Planning Councils, in collaboration with regional stakeholders, spearheaded the development of the seven-county Southeast Florida Regional Partnership (Partnership) and its successful designation as an inaugural U.S. HUD Sustainable Community. Completed in 2014, the Partnership's Seven50: Southeast Florida Prosperity Plan, a 50-year vision and plan, reflects general agreement around priority initiatives and investment in key areas of importance to Southeast Florida's future. Broadly stated, these initiatives are focused on issues related to Everglades and waterways; balanced mobility/transportation; climate preparedness and resilience; education and workforce; and economic competitiveness and opportunity. The Prosperity Plan highlights a "Region in Motion" as the preferred development scenario with an emphasis on quality transit and transit-oriented development as critical to the region's future resiliency and greater prosperity.

This plan will advance implementation of the Southeast Florida Regional Partnership's Seven50: Southeast Florida Regional Prosperity Plan by advancing the development of transit corridors and transit supportive projects; reducing congestion and greenhouse gas emissions; enhancing connectivity and economic opportunity for communities and the region's workforce; and enhancing regional mobility.

RESOLUTION 16-01

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF MIAMI-DADE METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (MPO) TRANSIT EXPANSION THROUGH THE STRATEGIC MIAMI AREA RAPID TRANSIT (SMART) PLAN

WHEREAS, the South Florida Regional Council is a regional public policy and planning agency representing the geographic area of Miami-Dade, Broward, and Monroe counties;

WHEREAS, the South Florida Regional Council is voluntarily created pursuant to an Interlocal Agreement of Monroe, Miami-Dade, and Broward counties, and Florida Statutes;

WHEREAS, the Council Board consists of county and municipal elected officials, gubernatorial appointees, and ex-officio representatives representing the South Florida Water Management District and the Florida departments of Transportation, Environmental Protection, and Economic Opportunity;

WHEREAS, the Council's mission is to work with, and provide assistance to, its member units of local governments and other regional stakeholders to develop and implement creative strategies that will result in more prosperous and equitable communities, a healthier and cleaner environment, and a more vibrant economy;

WHEREAS, in 2010 the South Florida and Treasure Coast Regional Planning Councils, in collaboration with regional stakeholders, spearheaded the development of the seven-county Southeast Florida Regional Partnership (Partnership) and its successful designation as an inaugural U.S. HUD Sustainable Community;

WHEREAS, completed in 2014, the Partnership's Seven50: Southeast Florida Prosperity Plan, a 50-year vision and plan, reflects general agreement around priority initiatives and investment in key areas of importance to Southeast Florida's future;

WHEREAS, broadly stated, these initiatives are focused on issues related to Everglades and waterways; balanced mobility / transportation; climate preparedness and resilience; education and workforce; and economic competitiveness and opportunity;

WHEREAS, the Partnership's Seven50: Southeast Florida Prosperity Plan highlights a "Region in Motion" as the preferred development scenario with an emphasis on quality transit and transit-oriented development as critical to the region's future resiliency and greater prosperity;

WHEREAS, in 2002, the electors of Miami-Dade County approved the imposition of a one-half percent surtax with the purpose of improving mass transit within Miami-Dade County;

WHEREAS, in 2014 Miami-Dade County ranked 12th, along with Atlanta and Detroit, as one of the nation's most congested urban areas according to the Texas A&M Transportation Institute's 2015 Urban Mobility Scorecard;


WHEREAS, the People's Transportation Plan includes eight (8) rapid transit corridors located throughout Miami-Dade County;

WHEREAS, under Resolution #06-16, dated February 16, 2016, the MPO Governing Board unanimously approved a policy to set as highest priority for the community the advancement of Rapid Transit Corridors and transit supportive projects in Miami-Dade County;

WHEREAS, under Resolution #26-16, dated April 21, 2016, the MPO Governing Board unanimously endorsed the Strategic Miami Area Rapid Transit (SMART) Plan and directed the MPO Executive Director to work with the MPO Fiscal Priorities Committee (FPC) to determine the costs and potential sources of funding for Project Development and Environmental (PD&E) study for each selected corridor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SOUTH FLORIDA REGIONAL COUNCIL, that the Council wishes to express its support for Miami-Dade Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and its leadership to provide rapid transit corridors along the six (6) corridors selected in the Strategic Miami Area Rapid Transit (SMART) Plan. This plan will advance implementation of the Southeast Florida Regional Partnership's Seven50: Southeast Florida Regional Prosperity Plan by reducing congestion and greenhouse gas emissions; enhancing connectivity and economic opportunity for communities and the region's workforce; and enhancing regional mobility.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A POLICY OF THIS BOARD TO SET AS HIGHEST PRIORITY THE ADVANCEMENT OF RAPID TRANSIT CORRIDOR PROJECTS IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY; AND DIRECTING THE MPO EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR DESIGNEE TO AMEND THE 2040 LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN TO INCLUDE SAID POLICY

WHEREAS, Title 23 US Code designates and provides the MPO as the lead agency with the authority to carry out the transportation planning process within Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan Update (LRTP) as approved on October 23, 2014, reflects all of the federal MAP-21 National Goals and the 2060 Florida Transportation Plan (FTP) goals. Furthermore, the LRTP addresses all federal, state, regional and local requirements; and

WHEREAS, the MPO Governing Board Chair has emphasized a renewed sense of urgency to improve transit mobility options with the creation of the Transit Solutions Committee and the Fiscal Priorities Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Transit Solutions Committee and the Fiscal Priorities Committee are responsible for identifying immediate opportunities to advance and prioritize funding for mass transit services; and

WHEREAS, this body is responsible for conducting the transportation planning process in Miami-Dade County and recognizes that Rapid Transit Corridor Projects are highest priority and should be advanced in order to provide a comprehensive mobility network that increases regional mobility, reduces congestion, and considers the transportation needs of all residents within the County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR THE MIAMI URBANIZED AREA, that the MPO Governing Board hereby establishes a policy to set as highest priority for this community the advancement of Rapid Transit Corridor and transit supportive projects in Miami-Dade County; and directing the MPO Executive Director or designee to amend the 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan to include said policy, providing no currently funded projects are negatively impacted.
