SUBJECT: APPOINTMENTS TO THE REVOLVING LOAN FUND LOAN ADMINISTRATION BOARD

BACKGROUND

The South Florida Regional Planning Council (SFRPC) manages a loan fund through a grant agreement with the U.S. Economic Development Administration. The goal of the SFRPC/EDA Revolving Loan Fund Program is to support economic development activities which result in the creation or retention of jobs, additional wealth, higher wages, and a better quality of life in the region.

This loan fund is overseen by a Revolving Loan Fund Committee (RLF Committee), appointed by the SFRPC. At its February 27, 2017 meeting the Council approved the expansion of the RLF Committee from five to seven members by adding two additional positions to be filled by a business owner and banking/finance representative.
