Sam Goren, Legal Counsel, gave a detailed explanation of the SEFRPI's history and significance in relation to the South Florida Regional Planning Council.

II. Approval of SEFRPI Agenda

III. Action Items

A. <u>Minutes of Previous Meeting</u>

Boardmember Walters made a motion to approve the Minutes from the previous meeting. Boardmember Udine seconded the motion, which carried by a unanimous vote.

B. Financial Report

Boardmember Walters made a motion to approve the Financial Report. Boardmember Furr seconded the motion, which carried by a unanimous vote.

IV. Program Reports and Activities

A. <u>Presentation on the Southeast Florida DataCommon by Keren Prize Bolter, PhD. Climate, Policy, &</u> Geospatial Analyst, SFRPC

Dr. Keren Prize Bolter explained in detail the Southeast Florida DataCommon and thanked the Councilmembers for their support. PowerPoint handouts were available at the Councilmembers' seats for their use. She described the DataCommon tools: "data stories", data collection, mapping & visualization, data analysis, information accessibility, community participation and data-driven outcomes. The draft website can be viewed at www.sfregionalcouncil.org/data-common. The DataCommon can promote better communication, more informed policy making, shared understanding of the region and can be a common platform to view important issues throughout Southeast Florida. Dr. Bolter shared important information regarding the engagement opportunities, visualizations, open access to existing website visualizations and technical support, datasets, and templates. Dr. Bolter informed the Councilmembers that several SFRPC programs use the DataCommon, including the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy Update (CEDS) and two resilience projects.

There were questions on the sources and accuracy of the data sources and analysis, and if the different databases are comparable. Dr. Bolter stated that the viewers of the DataCommon cannot create their own visualization, but they can view premade visualization on the website. However, Councilmembers, core partners, and the SFRPC can change the visualizations. There is an agreement between the partners that the information provided is accurate.

Vince Edwards, Geospatial Analyst, explained that as with any story, conclusions should not be drawn from any analyses. He further described the visualization process, the website information, "ground truthing", and the DataCommon's various uses via a data story.

Discussion ensued regarding who would use the segments (housing, transportation, income, population growth, etc.) of the DataCommon. Planners, municipalities, public and those who are looking for

comparisons and best uses for land development and transportation solutions would be interested. Mr. Edwards stated that the analyses can be published on various social media sites. Dr. Bolter explained the fees, trial membership and partnership information.

Chair Asseff requested this discussion to be continued at another meeting since the DataCommon is a valuable tool for visioning, long term planning, transportation, etc.
