Broward MPO - Vision 2100

- Long-range planning role of the MPO
- Anticipates premium transit corridors
 - Broward County Transportation Surtax
 - (\$300M+ per year)
- Change in approach for Hubs planning
 - Provide transit infrastructure
 - Improve pedestrian/ bicycle connectivity to transit
 - Most locations are streetside transfers
 - Integrate transit into the built environment
 - Not “one size fits all”






